JASON CASARES DENIES FALSE CHARGES OF MISCONDUCT

Jason Casares (Cuh-SAR-ess), an administrator at Indiana University Bloomington, categorically denies the false accusations of sexual misconduct leveled against him by a colleague on the board of the Association for Student Conduct Administration ("ASCA"). The ASCA (www.theasca.org) is an organization of college administrators from across the United States.

The claims made by Mr. Casares' accuser, NYU employee Jill Creighton, were the subject of a comprehensive investigation by an outside law firm hired by the ASCA for that purpose. The outside investigators found no evidence of misconduct by Mr. Casares, and determined that Ms. Creighton's claims were not valid.

Despite the outcome of the investigation, Ms. Creighton has made inappropriate and false public statements reasserting her claims against Mr. Casares over social media, and in person to attendees at an ASCA conference this week in Florida. In response, the ASCA promptly issued a strongly worded statement that included the following language: "Following a rigorous investigation, [the investigating law firm] determined that Ms. Creighton's claims could not be substantiated."
